


# Biochemical Society Grants

# Conferences and Travel

# **General Travel Grants**

Postgraduate, Early Career, Full and Emeritus members may apply for financial support of up to £750 to attend scientific meetings, training courses or to visit other laboratories.

# Student, Early Career and Full Member Bursaries

Up to £300 to support attendance of members at Biochemical Society events.

### **International Sponsored Places**

Occasional funding opportunities arise to attend conferences with our international partner societies.

#### **Harden Bursaries**

Assist students and scientists in the early stages of their career to attend our Harden Conferences.



#### **Summer Vacation Studentships**

Full and Early Career members can apply to support an undergraduate student to undertake a summer lab placement. Receiving a grant for stipends of £279 per week for 6 weeks via a joint application with the student.

### Eric Reid Fund for Methodology

Provides modest financial support of up to  $\pm 5,000$  for benchwork, with an emphasis on methodology.

### **FEBS Fellowships**

Members of the Biochemical Society automatically become members of the Federation of European Biochemical Societies (FEBS) and, as a result, can apply for FEBS Fellowships. These provide support for successful applicants to work in a different FEBS country.

## Travel Award for International Skills and Knowledge Exchange

These grants provide support to members from a lower-income economy to visit a host laboratory or support members to visit a lower-income economy to disseminate knowledge and build research capacity.

#### **Krebs Memorial Fund**

Scholarship to provide funding during a PhD for an outstanding candidate whose otherwise very promising research career has been interrupted by non-academic reasons beyond their control.

# Sponsorship

## **Scientific Outreach Grants**

These grants of up to £1000 support outreach activities that communicate the excitement of molecular bioscience to young people and the community.

### **Sponsored Events**

Financial support of up to £500 can be awarded to members running independently organized scientific conferences, regional or student focused events at their institution.

# **Sponsored Seminar Series**

Grants of up to £1500 are available for members to host a series of seminars from guest speakers at their institution throughout the year.

## **Student Society Grants**

 $\pounds100$  grants to run small events are available to student societies related to the molecular biosciences.

## **Diversity in Science Grants**

Funding of up to £500 for projects that address issues related to diversity in science.

### **Carer Support Grants**

Financial support to assist with the additional care costs arising from participation in a Biochemical Society event or course.

# **Stay Connected Bursaries**

Funding to help members who are currently on a career break or have recently returned to work attend Society meetings and courses.

# **Undergraduate Recognition Awards**

\$50 prizes and one year's free membership of the Biochemical Society. These are awarded by our Local Ambassadors to recognize outstanding undergraduates.
